As a way to honor the Dutch heritage of the 1741 Bouman-Stickney Farmstead, the Readington Museums will be hosting Dutch Sint-Nicolaas Day on **Sunday, December 2, 2018** between 1:00 and 4:00 p.m. Sinterklaas will be available for pictures and Colonial musicians, Anne and Ridley Enslow, will perform historic holiday pieces through the ages that showcase instruments authentic to the period, (violin and hammered dulcimer.)

In addition, Bev Altrath and Arlene Soong will demonstrate 18th century Dutch cooking using the Farmstead's original open hearth. They plan to make waffles and gingerbread over the open flame. Visitors may also make a pomander ornament to take home, as well as enjoy cider and homemade Dutch cookies. The program is free, but donations are gladly accepted.

Garden Club of Hunterdon Returns to the Bouman-Stickney Farmstead After 71 Years

In 1947, the Community Garden Club of Hunterdon County held a meeting and toured the gardens of the estate of renowned actress Dorothy Stickney. Today, the property is known as the Bouman-Stickney Farmstead. Stickney was not in attendance that day, but the caretaker of her gardens, Mrs. J Albert Petersen, was there to represent Stickey. During that time, Dorothy Stickney and her playwright husband, Howard Lindsay, starred in the Broadway play, *Life with Father*. Incidentally, this play holds the record of the longest-running non-musical play on Broadway, and ran for more than seven years. The Garden Club continues to promote community service, but over the years it has changed names, faces, and meeting places. They are now known as the Community Garden Club of Hunterdon County. To celebrate their 85th year of service, they returned to the former Stickney Estate to recreate the picture at the front of the house with the magnolia tree in the background. The original picture to the right, was printed in the August 21, 1947 edition of the Hunterdon Democrat.



